# WHAT DEGREE COURSE IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

We offer both Foundation Degrees and Honours Degrees in a range of subjects. Specific information about what's available in each subject area is explained later.

## FOUNDATION DEGREES

As a general guide, a Foundation Degree has 240 credits. Most Foundation Degrees require a student either to be working or to have a substantial work experience placement. Unlike some undergraduate programmes, they're not just about theory. They provide you with the knowledge and skills that employers need, by combining theory with its application to the workplace. This will help you to enhance your employment opportunities and to prepare for more responsibility or promotion.

In addition to the subject-specific modules, each student will complete four Learning in Action modules and two Research Methods & Study Skills modules. These will encourage independent thinking, develop your skills in academic writing, research and giving presentations, and train you to analyse and evaluate your progress and performance.

## HONOURS DEGREES

An Honours Degree has 360 credits. In some subjects, the Honours Degree is studied full-time over three years. In others, a Foundation Degree is studied first and this can then be topped up to an Honours Degree with one or two years' further study.

**Whichever degree you choose, you will probably only have to attend college for a maximum of two days a week, so you can complete your studies and coursework at times convenient to you.**



# WHY CHOOSE COLEG LLANDRILLO CYMRU?

1. If you have lived in Wales for the last three years continuously, you will only pay fees of £3,375 (subject to an annual increase) if you start studying for a university degree in 2012, either at Coleg Llandrillo Cymru or at another university or college. The Welsh Government will pay the difference between £3,375 and the fee charged by the university or college.
2. If you live at home, you could save thousands of pounds as you won't have to pay the additional accommodation costs incurred by students who live away from home.
3. The cost of living is lower than in most cities.
4. Like many of our students, you may be able to combine your studies with paid employment.
5. The recent Quality Assurance Agency Developmental Review was extremely positive, reinforcing the fact that Coleg Llandrillo Cymru's academic standards are of the highest quality.
6. Class sizes are small, usually less than 30, so you will get to know your tutors and fellow students on a personal level.
7. Lectures and workshops are interactive, enabling you to participate and build up your confidence.
8. Our online resources can be accessed remotely so you can work offsite on the days when you're not in College.
9. Our degrees enhance your employment opportunities and prepare you for more responsibility or promotion at work.
10. All our Foundation Degrees offer progression opportunities to Honours level of study, either here or at another university.

# DEAF STUDIES

Deaf Studies is a developing field of study in which people learn about sign language, linguistics and communication, psychology, the deaf community and deaf history, culture, education and literature.

Wales' first Foundation Degree course in Deaf Studies provides students with a broad knowledge and understanding of deaf culture and current issues within the deaf community, whilst concurrently developing a range of vocational skills to enable them to work in associated contexts and settings. These include Language Service Professionals who work with deaf people in the community, schools, colleges and universities: social workers, audiologists, teachers of the deaf, support services and deaf organisations.

Applicants should have passed British Sign Language Level 2 before beginning the course. Deaf Studies courses will run at the Colwyn Bay Learning Centre.

# ENGINEERING, ENERGY & POWER

In response to the demand for engineers within the electrical power industry, Bangor University and Coleg Llandrillo Cymru have developed a new Foundation Degree for engineers who are currently working or aspiring to work in the emerging power sector in North Wales.

## Foundation Degree (FdEng) Energy & Power Technologies\*\*

This Foundation Degree aims to develop the knowledge and skills of technical and engineering staff who work in, have an association with or are interested in joining the industry. The course will help you to progress in your field or gain entry into wind, tidal, gas, nuclear or hydro power companies.

The first year of the engineering course is based on taught modules, workshops, field trips, work-based modules and site visits where students will develop fundamental underpinning theory and technical skills for engineers.

The second year explores fundamental power engineering theory that will enable candidates to take up technical, supervisory or managerial roles in power or engineering related companies.

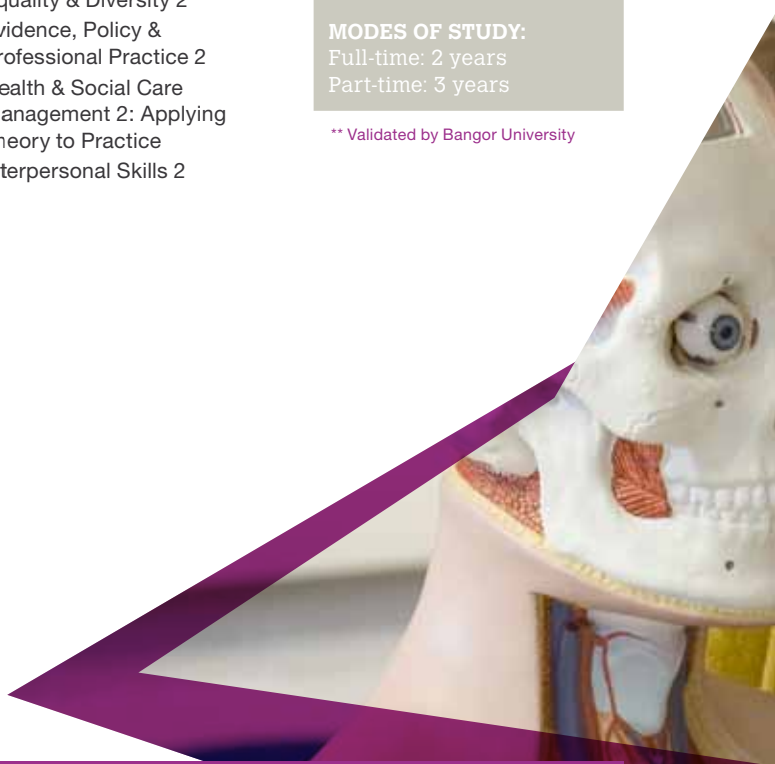

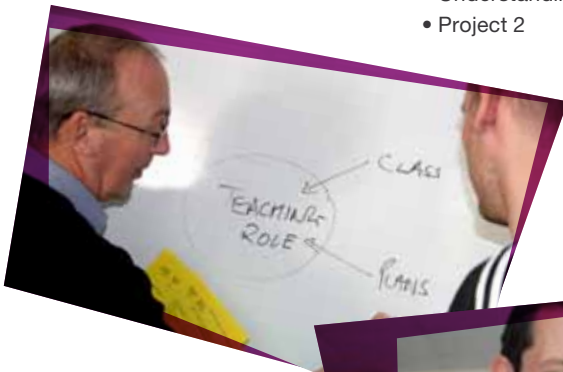

# WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

The College has ten main campuses across North Wales, with the majority of our degree courses delivered at the Rhos-on-Sea Campus. Our Higher Education Adviser and Student Services Team in our Advice & Guidance Centres will be able to provide more detailed information on fees and full-time/part-time study, as well as the financial support that may be available.

## COURSE MODULES & CREDITS

Modules listed under each course are indicative and do not provide a complete list of all modules that will be studied. This information can be found on individual course leaflets on the College's website. Each year, you will study a number of different modules, whose size will range from 5 – 20 credits.

## MODES OF STUDY

The modes of study indicated for each course relate to the number of credits studied in an academic year. If the mode of study is full-time, you will be studying 120 credits in each twelve month academic year (September – August). If it is part-time, you will be studying up to 90 credits.

## FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME FEES

Whether you pay full-time or part-time fees depends on the number of credits studied in a twelve month academic year, not your attendance pattern. You will have to pay full-time fees if you are studying 120 credits in a twelve month academic year.

If you are studying up to 90 credits in a twelve month academic year, you will pay part-time fees.

## FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME ATTENDANCE

A full-time course does not require attendance at College for four or five days a week. Attendance will vary from one degree course to another, but whatever you study, you will usually only have classes on one or two days a week, even if you are studying full-time. Some classes run in the evening, some courses run for about 30 weeks and others run for about 45 weeks in each twelve month academic year.
